## **Mandatory components of a manuscript**

- Size limit: Manuscripts may be no longer than 20 pages of A4 for Basic Researches, 15 pages of A4 for Clinical Researches, 5 pages of A4 for Case Reports.
- Manuscript layouts: Manuscript should be prepared in following orders: front cover, abstract, text, bibliography, tables, figures/captions, author's checklist, and signature of author(s). Each section must begin on a new page.
- Language: Text should be written in fluent, plain, readable American or English-style English.

## **Title page**

- Components: The title page must contain all of the followings: clear title, name and affiliation of all authors, information of the corresponding author (address, telephone number, fax number, and e-mail address), and running head.
- Authorship limitation: A maximum of 4 authors may be included on Case Reports and Technical Reports. Original Article should have no more than 6 authors.

## **Abstract**

- Words count: Abstract should have no longer than 250 words for Basic and Clinical Researches and 150 words for Case Reports.
- Keywords: Up to 5 keywords or phrases suitable for use in an index can be given.

## **Text**

- Structure: Basic Researches and Clinical Researches are organized as follows: Introduction, Methods, Results, and Discussion. Case Reports should be provided in the order of Case Report and Discussion.
- Headings: Provide appropriate headings and subheadings logically and consistently.
- Figures and tables: Cite in numerical order as they are first mentioned in the text.
- Informed consent/IRB document: State in the methods section.

## **References**

- Style: References are described according to the rules of the Journal of Chest Surgery.
- Options: Authors are highly encouraged to cite Korean publications. All Korean references must be translated into English if possible.

## **Tables**

- Style: Tables are described according to the rules of the Journal of Chest Surgery. Tables should be self-explanatory, and data should not be duplicated in the text.

## **Figures/Images**

- Figure resolution: Author must guarantee the quality of figures. It should be noted that the manuscript could be rejected if print-suitable high quality figures are not provided at the initial phase of submission.
- Figure legend: Figure legend should be self-explanatory. The present tense must be used for the description. Appropriate description of dyeing method and magnification for histological figure should be provided.

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
